No specific IFIP TC2 activity took place in Switzerland, although several IFIP-supported events were organized elsewhere, e.g., the International Conference on Software Composition (SC 2013) sponsored by IFIP WG 2.4 and the 9th International Conference on Open Source Systems (OSS2013) sponsored by IFIP WG 2.13.

The IFIP TC2 Meeting was held in Poznan on September 10, 2013. I could not attend personally (I was chairing P2P 2013, which was held at the same dates) but Julia Lawall acted as a proxy. The minutes of the meeting are attached. Notable points discussed at the meeting include:

- Bertrand Meyer was nominated for the Silver Core IFIP Award.
- A new Web site for TC2 has been set up at <http://ifip-tc2.paluno.uni-due.de>, as well as a new mailing list.
- The Manfred Paul Award has not been given last year but will be awarded by the OSS conference for the next few years.
- There are concerns that IFIP and TC2 are not visible enough. More work needs to be done by WGs and representatives to advertise IFIP activities.

IFIP World Computer Congress. There seems to be no World Computer Congress in 2013.

Forthcoming TC2 conferences: Software Composition 2013 (2.4, Budapest), OSS 2013 (2.13, Koper-Capodistria, Slovenia), ESOCC (2.14, Malaga), ICSOC (2.14, Berlin), MODELSWARD (TC2, Lisbon).

Next TC2 meeting: May or June 2014. The venue is not yet decided.

Manfred Paul Award for 2012/2013: No award was made for 2012. It was decided to propose to the IFIP conference OSS, which is regularly organized by WG 2.13, to give the Manfred Paul Award as its best paper award.

1. Keynote

The meeting started at 9:00. As the meeting was not co-located with a conference this year, there was no keynote. We thus moved immediately to point 2.

3. Election of TC2 officers

No elections are planned for 2013.

4. WG organization overview

As a new WG chair, Frank Tip asked for an overview of the general principles of how a WG works. Michael Goedicke provided an overview, covering a number of points:

A working group typically has a chair, a vice chair, and a secretary. Every working group has a chair. Some working groups omit one or the other of the remaining officers.

Officer terms are for three years. An officer can be elected to the same office twice in a row. An officer who has reached the term limit (ie 6 years) is eligible for election to a different office.

In some WGs of other TCs, the secretary is not a member of the working group. It could be a more organizational person. This issue is currently under discussion at the IFIP GA.

A WG typically has 20-40 members. It should strive for a good coverage of the community. Members are expected to regularly attend WG meetings. In most working group, a member who has missed 2-4 meetings is dismissed from the group. The rules vary. Kevin Ryan suggested that written guidelines from TC2 could be useful.

A WG can organize an IFIP conference. This is well viewed, because it brings publicity to TC2, and may bring some money per attendee per day into TC2.

Meetings are typically 3-5 days. Some groups have another short business meeting at a conference relevant to the working group topic.

Ulrik Schultz suggested that we could add to the web page links to IFIP information that could be useful for WG chairs, or even WG members.

5. IFIP update

5.1 IFIP news

WCC was held in Amsterdam in 2012, but was not a financial success. There is a discussion as to what should be done instead. There is a thought of having it on a specific topic. There is a possibility for 2015 in South Korea, that will be discussed at this IFIP GA meeting. Risk sharing has changed –

the organizer should now pay a fixed price to IFIP for IFIP services, and then the organizer assumes any profit or loss.

Kevin Ryan suggests that WCC could be a venue for academics to interact with policymakers. Sort of a UN of computing.

Julio Leite wonders how national society representatives can help. Michael Goedicke replies that TC2 chair can promote and discuss an idea, and can then communicate this to national society representatives, who can then communicate back to the national societies.

Michael observes that IFIP is a UNESCO organization, but is currently one of the less important kinds.

IFIP organizes the CIO forum, which is directed towards industry.

IFIP GA is now discussing formalization of the concept of emeritus membership. Currently such a status does not really exist.

We plan to spend money for the Manfred Paul award, and collect money for conferences as it becomes available.

If a conference is sponsored, it can have a Springer proceedings via IFIP, from which we get the royalties. IFIP sponsored conferences also give us a small amount of money per participant.

IFIP may make available a small amount of money to help students from developing countries attend conferences, or to help organization of conferences in developing countries.

5.3 Nominations for IFIP Awards

Silver Core

- Bertrand Meyer, IFIP TC2 Chair (proposed by M.Goedcke and J.Nawrocki)

Fragments from IFIP Standing Orders:

6.1 Silver Core

6.1.2 It shall be granted by the IFIP General Assembly on recommendation of the Internal Awards Committee, conforming to the rules defined below. [...]

6.1.3 Eligibility

Eligible for nomination are: living persons who have served during a period of six years or more, and have **been present at no less than 2/3 of the meetings** in the following positions or equivalent:

- [...] **Chairman of a Technical Committee**

1. Award nominations for **Editors of at least two volumes of Proceedings** or equivalent publications **will be submitted for comment to the TC and WG Chairman** in charge of the corresponding Conferences and to the Contracts Officer. [...] When there is more than one Editor for a volume then each will receive fractional credit in proportion to the number of Editors involved.
2. **Combinations of the above.**

Justification: Bertrand Meyer is:

- a member of IFIP TC2 from 2004 until 2011 and attended 6 meetings, not attended 2 (attendance ratio is 75% vs. 66% required by the IFIP Standing Orders).
- IFIP TC2 Chair since 2009. Attended all the 3 meetings of TC2 during his term.
- a co-editor of two official IFIP proceedings (CEE-SET 2007 and 2008) published as **LNCS 4980** (one of five co-editors) and **LNCS 5082** (one of three co-editors). Another one has now been published.

Moreover, he helped a lot in establishing Central- and East-European Conference on Software Engineering Techniques. He introduced new practices into the work of IFIP TC2: since 2009 the meetings of the committee have been co-located with the TOOLS conference and TC2 members had an opportunity to listen to very interesting keynote speeches presented during the conference. Thanks to him, since 2009 TC2 members are offered free lunches and coffee breaks at TC2 meetings. Moreover, at the end of each meeting there are short research presentations given by TC2 members.

Outstanding Service Award

According to IFIP Standing Orders:

6.2.2 It shall be granted by the General Assembly, **on recommendation of TC Chairmen**, after approval by the Internal Awards Committee.

6.2.3 Eligibility

Eligible for nomination are TC and WG Members not normally eligible for the Silver Core Award. The TC Chairmen shall submit their nominations in accordance with the selection criteria listed below. These criteria are not winding and are given primarily as general guidelines. The Internal Awards Committee, working in agreement with the TC Chairmen, will ensure that the nominations list does not exceed **twenty names per year**.

6.2.4 Selection Criteria

Active role played at TC or WG level, for instance:

- initiatives taken and work done to enhance the image and the effectiveness of the TC or WG
- proposals made and actions taken to expand activities to new innovative domains.

Leading role played in the organization of technical events (conferences, seminars, etc.) for instance as OC or PC Chairman, or as member of the local support organization.

Actions undertaken for the benefit of Developing Countries (DCs). For instance, organization of IFIP events in DCs; help given to DC delegates to attend events, training courses, etc.; transfer of product know-how, documentation, etc. to DCs.

Cooperation with other learned Societies, Sister Federations or International Organizations to enhance the activities of IFIP.

Duration of service within the TC or WG and active participation to IFIP meetings and activities.

Nominations for an Outstanding Service Award have been submitted for Prof. Anthony Finkelstein (WG 2.9), for Prof. Brian Ford (WG 2.5), and for Prof. Chris Lengauer (WG 2.11). A nomination of Bertrand Meyer for a Silver Core award was submitted as well.

5.4 Status of emeritus members

WG 2.1 has asked several times about the status of emeritus members. Several other working groups also have emeritus members, or members with some similar title. There is now an initiative higher up in IFIP, directed by Mike.Hinchey <mike.hinchey@lero.ie> to bring a proposal to GA on Emeritus members and the idea of having past-Chair and Chair-elect positions (exact titles to be confirmed).

5.5 Misc

There is a concern that some countries have to pay much more than others to be a member of IFIP.

There is a concern that small/developing countries are rarely represented at TC2 meetings, due to lack of funding from the national society. People from all countries, even if they have funding, may not be able to justify travel to events that are not specifically related to some funded project.

Many countries reward only ISI mentioned publications, so Springer might not be attractive enough.

Julio suggests that IFIP should encourage the national societies to support the travel of representatives to TC meetings. There is a concern, though that the national societies feel that they are paying too much already.

6. Action items

6.1 Working group officers

According to IFIP Bylaws, Section 4.37:

The term of office of Working Group Chairmen and Vice-Chairmen shall be three years and may be renewed once only.

WG 2.3: A new chair has been elected. That person will take office in 2014 and choose a Vice Chair at that time.

WG 2.6: A new chair should be elected.

Unfortunately, the mailing list is not working properly. New additions don't seem to be included.

A working group has asked Michael if he can host their website. Michael believes this is possible, and will send an email about it shortly.

6.3 IFIP Summer School

During the Zurich meeting the following was agreed:

For the earlier mentioned proposal of IFIP Summer School co-located with a CLEI conference Hernan Astudillo is responsible for performing a short feasibility study and providing more details.

Hernan Astudillo previously requested to suspend this issue for the time being.

It is still suspended. The yearly CLEI meeting is in October, and Hernan may discuss it with them then. But he makes no commitment at this point. Julio could perhaps involve Brazil.

7. WG Reports

See attached document.

After the time of the submission of their report, WG 2.5 decided to organize a working conference in 2016 on the theme of "Data Intensive Science". They would like to have the approval of TC2 for this effort.

Ernesto suggests that database people should be interest in this.

Jerzy wonders whether they should have the event as part of the WCC, which will also be in 2016. The theme of that, however, is smart cities.

Michael will get back to 2.5 about this.

There was some concern about 2.5. Their 2012 meeting had low attendance, and there were fewer observers (2) than new member invitations (5). TC2 would like to know how often the new members had previously attended. The new members will only be admitted if they have attended some previous meetings.

There was also some concern about attendance for 2.6, as the 2012 meeting had very low attendance. The 2012 meeting was just after a workshop relevant to the working group, and a number of members were not able to stay on. 2.6 has also met in August 2013, after the end of this year's reporting period, and this meeting had a larger number of member attendees.

WG 2.10 has put some effort into editing wikipedia pages relevant to their group. TC2 considers this to be an admirable effort.

WG 2.14 states that a meeting will be held in October, but there are reports that this meeting has already been held.

Michael Goedicke suggested that if a working group organizes a conference, they should let the national society of the host nation know. Members of the national society could be given reduced rates, and in exchange the national society could provide publicity.

8. Future events and Manfred Paul Award

8.1 Conferences

The following IFIP-sponsored conferences have been announced to take place in 2013/2014:

- Software Composition 2013 (2.4, Budapest), OSS 2013 (2.13, Koper-Capodistria, Slovenia), ESOCC (2.14, Malaga), ICSOC (2.14, Berlin), MODELSWARD (TC2, Lisbon).

8.2 Next TC2 meeting

The IFIP TC2 meeting in 2014 will be probably in May-June. Michael Goedicke will let us know when and where.

Antonio Vallecillo proposes co-location with STAF (<http://stafconferences.info/>), the successor of TOOLS, which will be in York in mid July 2014. Antonio is on the steering committee, and promises to try to obtain similar conditions to those we got previously at TOOLS.

Frank Tip suggested that we consider colocation with either PLDI, in June 2014 in Edinburgh, or ECOOP, in July 2014 in Uppsala. There is a concern that PLDI will be in a hotel, which would be expensive for us. There is a concern that July is too late, as many people may be on vacation at that time.

Michael Goedicke offered Essen, independent of any conference. Essen is convenient to get to via eg Frankfurt / Düsseldorf or Cologne, which are major transportation hubs.

8.3 Manfred Paul Award

No award was made for 2012. We will let it go.

Since the plan put in place last year, involving soliciting nominations from several conferences and then choosing between them at the TC2 level, was not enacted, there was a new discussion about how to organize the awarding of the award.

One issue considered was whether it should be for a best paper or should be for a researcher, independent of a specific publication. Another issue considered was the need for continuity. Frank Tip was concerned about entrusting the award to a different conference each year.

Julio Leite proposed giving the award to a young researcher; over time this would earn a reputation as something to aspire to in the community. Nominations would be collected from the WGs and the awardee would be chosen by TC2. Julia Lawall was concerned that this would do little to improve the visibility of TC2, which is one of the main objectives of the award, because all of the discussion about the award would be performed by people already involved in TC2.

In the end, it was decided to allow the conference OSS, organized by 2.13, to give out the award for the next few years. This would increase the visibility of TC2, because the award could eg appear in the call for papers. OSS has also been an IFIP conference for a number of years, so it is nice to be able to give back to them. Giving it to OSS for a few years would also address the problem of continuity.

8.4 Proposal for STAP conferences

In order to increase communication between working groups, to increase attendance at TC2 meetings, and to increase the number of conferences (open events) organized by TC2 working groups, Jerzy

proposed an idea for a week-long collection of conferences organized by working groups at the same time as the TC2 meeting, to first be organized for 2015.

It was suggested that the proposed 5 days was too long, and the proposed 2 invited speakers per day was too many. There was significant opposition to the idea of such an event replacing the working group meetings. Working group members value the fact that there are no publications associated with the meetings, and different groups have different traditions about when and where to meet.

One alternative proposal was to make the event like a summer school, with student participants and with WG members as invited speakers.

Another alternative proposal was to use this as an umbrella in which WGs could organize conferences. In this way, the WG would only have to take care of the scientific content, but could take advantage of a common organization.

Another alternative proposal was to instead bring all of the TC administrative meetings together. The TCs probably have fewer traditions than the individual working groups, and it would be an opportunity for a quite wide range of ideas, in eg a workshop day after the administrative meeting.

Jerzy will contact all of the working groups directly and see if there are at least 5 who would like to participate.

8.4 TC2 visibility

Michael raised the concern that IFIP and TC2 are not visible enough.

One suggestion was to follow the lead of WG 2.10 and have each WG work on the wikipedia pages related to their field, but it was objected that this would likely not lead to the introduction of any links to TC2, despite being a good idea in general.

Apparently there is a TC2 wikipedia page, but that needs to be brought up to date. On that page, the last working group is 2.13.

A goal is to convince the national societies that their membership in IFIP is important. Masami Hagiya says that there are very few Japanese members of working groups, but that people from Japan are often invited.

So it would be useful for him to have a list of people who have been invited as observers, so he can show the Japanese society that people from Japan benefit from IFIP, even though not many are members.

Jerzy likewise thinks that the many Polish members of working groups is an important point for the Polish national society.

9. Discussion

9.1 How to improve interaction at meetings, particularly with respect to laptops

Discussion led by Ulrik Schultz. Ulrik described three new features in the organization of WG 2.11 meetings (Split of time between talk and questions with the session leader being able to cut things off, no announced schedule, and no laptops/phones/etc.). Other WG leaders reported on how things are organized int their groups.

10. Speakers

Julio Cesar Leite, on the Sociedade Brasileira de Computação

Julio Leite gave an overview of the activities of the Brazilian computer society. This was followed by some discussion of how TC2 could interact with the described events. Perhaps interaction with an existing summer school on software (CSOFT) could be useful.

Kevin Ryan, on From research to product – an example

This talk described how one of Kevin's students both finished his PhD and started a software company based on his research. The company was eventually purchased by IBM.
